

Feinstein marks end of wetlands restoration project

MENLO PARK, CA (KGO) -- The landscape people see as they drive over the Dumbarton Bridge is now dramatically different.

On Tuesday, Senator Dianne Feinstein and other dignitaries marked the completion of the latest wetlands restoration project. For more than a year, crews used heavy machinery to turn the 237 acres of the former Cargill Salt Pond into rich marshlands for dozens of bird species.

The project is part of a massive effort Bay Area-wide to restore the bay from Santa Clara County to Napa.
